

# In Memoriam- Dr. William Lumb

- Born November 26, 1921 in Sioux City. Passed away on Saturday, February 3, 2018.
- Grew up in Manhattan, attended Manhattan High School, and graduated from Kansas State University in Veterinary Medicine in 1943. Served in the Veterinary Corps from 1943 to 1946.
- In 1946 went to Boston for an internship and residency at the Angell Memorial Animal Hospital
- Texas A&M,; St. Paul, MN, Colorado State (taught small animal surgery and medicine), Michigan State
- In 1960 they returned to Colorado State University
- 1963 he was made director of the surgical laboratory, a new facility on the Foothills Campus, where he developed a graduate teaching and research program in surgery and anesthesiology.
- It was a multidisciplinary program, involving veterinarians, physicians, engineers and ancillary personnel.
- He continued as director until 1978 and retired from the university in 1980.
- Besides his DVM, he held a Master's degree from Texas A&M University, a PhD from the University of Minnesota and an honorary doctor or science degree from The Ohio State University.

# In Memoriam- Dr. William Lumb

- Past president and a founding diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Surgeons
- A founding diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesiologists.
- Colorado Veterinarian of the Year, Gaines Award, Ralston-Purina Award, Markowitz Award, Glover Award and ACVS Founder's Award for Career Achievement.
- Held the first patent for a complete prosthetic vertebra and a second for spinal plates.
- Cited in Who's Who in America, Who's Who in Science and Engineering, and Who's Who in Medicine and Health Care.
- Authored two books, "Small Animal Anesthesia" and "Veterinary Anesthesia." The latter was translated into Japanese and Spanish and is now in its 5th edition.
- Authored portions of ten other books and 150 professional papers.
- Provided scholarships to Native American students at Colorado State University and Kansas State University.
- His epitaph reads, "He was an Educator."

# Constitutional and Bylaws Amendments

- ***Reasons for language changes:***
- **Charter Diplomates** *The American Board of Specialty Specialists (ABVS) is no longer in favor of the term 'Charter Diplomate' which implies that these members had undergone competency examination; Charter Diplomates may be left in, stated as historical reference*
- **The appeals process** *The ABVS strongly suggests that the appeals committee has the final say and not the BOD; Appeals process needs to be independent.*
- **New ABVS committee** *The ABVS has been re-organized to form an oversight Veterinary Specialty Organizations Committee (VSOC) so that the overseeing body is not the body making the rules or setting the standards; VSOC will be comprised of a representative from each specialty college*
- Special Thank you to **Dr. Khursheed Mama** for continuing to represent the ACVAA on VSOC

# Constitutional Article V Amendment

- **Charter Diplomates** *The American Board of Specialty Specialists (ABVS) is no longer in favor of the term 'Charter Diplomate' which implies that these members had undergone competency examination; Charter Diplomates may be left in, stated as historical reference*
- Changed to five types of membership and mention charter diplomates from a historical perspective only
- The seven Founding Charter Diplomates became the original Board of Directors of the College and they initiated development of the ACVAA. At the BOD Meeting in 1976, thirteen Charter Diplomates (refer to the ACVAA website) who met the membership criteria and gained 2/3 support of the Board of Directors and the Council of Education of the AVMA joined the college. From that time on the Founding Charter Diplomates and Charter Diplomates were known as Diplomates of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesiologists.

# Bylaws Changes

- **The appeals process** *The ABVS strongly suggests that the appeals committee has the final say and not the BOD; Appeals process needs to be independent.*
- **Article I Membership and Examination**
- Section 4 - Appeals Procedure
- The Appeals Committee will make a **determination judgment and decision** and submit their decision to the Board of Directors. The Executive Secretary/Administrator will inform the appellant of the decision within 30 days of the original petition. ~~In the event of continued conflict between the petitioner and the College, appeals may be directed to the American Board of Veterinary Specialties with a copy to the ACVAA President and Chair of the Board of Directors.~~

# Bylaws Changes

# Voting

- Must commence within 60 days of the annual business meeting and you will receive the link to the survey around that time to vote
- Voting is all electronic now
- Ballots completed within 30 days following initiation of the voting shall be considered valid.
- Approval of amendments shall require an affirmative vote by two-thirds of the votes cast.

# 2018 ACVAA Certifying Examination

- June 1-3, 2018; Springhill Suites, Chicago
- Candidates took 100 M/C questions in the morning of Day 1 and 2.
- Candidates submitted 10 essays each (5 on each examination day).
- On morning of the first 2 days, 1 essay was required (cardiovascular physiology and anesthetic equipment) and the candidates chose 4 of 5 options in the afternoon.
- Ten CCE questions, each with multiple parts, were answered on the morning of the 3<sup>rd</sup> day.
- One candidate received special accommodations due to a casted wrist and was allowed to hand write the essays and CCE.
- Passing score for M/C, essay, and CCE accepted were the recommended cut score minus 1 standard error of judgement(SEJ)
- 27 candidates sat the MCQ and essay and CCE examination.
- Two additional candidates only took the CCE.

# 2018 ACVAA Certifying Examination

- Sixteen candidates took examination for the first time
- 10 candidates took examination for the second time (including 2 candidates just taking the CCE)
- 1 candidate took the exam for the fifth time
- 1 candidate took the exam for the ninth time
- 1 candidate took the exam for the 10<sup>th</sup> time after a 7 year lapse.
- 16/29 (55%) of candidates passed
- 13/29 (45%) of candidates failed
- First-time test-takers: 12/16 passed (75%)
- Second-time test-takers: 4/10 passed (40%)
- Multiple cycle test takers: 0/3 passed (0%)
- Pass rate for the MCQ was 74%
- Pass rate for the essays was 63%
- Pass rate for the CCE was 62%
- 1 candidate appealed but was unsuccessful

# 2018 ACVAA Certifying Examination

- **Cost for admin of exam 2018:**  
\$11,753.67 includes travel, hotel charges; re-imbursments for proctors, lunches, scanning and copying and shipping (does not include Prometrics or *Exam Soft* costs)
- **Income from exam 2018:**  
\$22,000.00 for exam fees; does not account for loss due to PayPal fees
- **Testing Centers –**
  - Looking into this again
  - Expensive
  - Problems with hours open to accommodate length of exam
  - ACVO switched to testing centers and then switched back

# Suggestions from the Exam Committee

- For all candidates who took the exam in 2018, the testing cycle will be re-started; i.e. for all candidates, 2018 will count as year 1 in their 3 year cycle.
- For candidates who have deferred or failed in the past but did not take the exam in 2018, their next attempt will be considered year 1 of the 3 year cycle.
- **Reason:** people who have attempted the exam in the past and did not pass had their MCQ and essays averaged. It is possible that someone passed the essays but did so poorly on the MCQ that they did not pass the “written exam”. We have now separated out all parts of the exam and so the fairest thing would be to allow everyone to start with a clean slate.
- **Pro:** This benefits the candidates in that it will be at least 1 year longer until they have to pay the increased exam fee and “resubmit credentials”.
- **Con:** May cause confusion amongst candidates. Will likely decrease income from exam for a few years.
- Providing unsuccessful candidates with an ACVAA diplomate mentor and more guidance on passing the exam?
- Limit the number of times a candidate can take the exam?

# Veterinary Anesthesia and Analgesia Update

- 1st Sept 2017 to 18th August 2018
- 281 manuscripts:
  - 75% research papers, 14% short communications, 8 review articles, 15 letters, 2 editorials and 4 perspectives.
- Geographical origin of submissions were 14.4% from Brazil, 14.4% from UK, 13.4% from USA, 6.9% from Italy, and from 34 other countries.
- Decisions within this time period, excluding abstracts, editorials, perspectives and letters was 79 accept, 91 reject with or without review, and 53 reject and resubmit.
- Acceptance rate, based on a total of 242 manuscripts, was 38.4%.
- The average number of days to first decision was 46 days (including time for manuscripts that are unsubmitted for rewriting or inclusion of more details before sending out for review).
- The average time from submission to accept decision was 5.9 months, and from submission to reject decision was 61 days.

# Veterinary Anesthesia and Analgesia Update

- **Journal Impact Factor**

- The 2 year Impact Factor for 2017 is 2.064. This is based on 324 citations in 2017 to items published in 2015 and 2016 divided by 157 citable papers in 2015 and 2016.
- Using the IF, Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia now ranks 14th out of 140 veterinary sciences journals.

- **Awards:**

- The Editors-in-Chief nominated 16 papers and two judges selected the awards.
